

teachers In the Resources and Books section there are links to many of the projects described in the book such as the school for the poor in Nepal There are links to Montessori initiatives such as Educateurs sans Frontières she experienced in Thailand Montessori for Dementia the Montessori course for teaching adolescents Montessori sports There are also details about the author's seven previous books each one presenting Montessori in very practical examples from a unique perspective Following Montessori principles can help anyone to dig deep and discover their inborn gifts to gain the experience and confidence to push boundaries to develop creative problem solving abilities resilience and compassion
